The above transcription was made from a tape recording of 8 minutes and 45 seconds — corresponding to 66½ clause complexes (CC) — of the Australian Broadcasting Commission's main evening television news broadcast on 11 November 1975. The portion of the broadcast transcribed above is an excerpt from a news conference in which Malcolm Fraser attempts to explain to the Australian public the events surrounding the unprecedented sacking of an elected centre-left government and its replacement by a centre-right caretaker government. At approximately the same time as the news conference was taking place, a group of construction industry workers was attempting to storm the Sydney Stock Exchange. The conventions used in the transcription are those set forth in M. A. K. Halliday's *A Course in Spoken English: Intonation* (Oxford: O.U.P., 1970), with one major exception: the location of the tonic is signaled by an asterisk preceding the initial boundary marker of the tonic foot, rather than by underlining of the tonic syllable. It should be noted that the iconic tone symbols used in the above transcription display the intonational analysis to the primary degree of delicacy only. Reconstructions of portions of the tape recording that were partly inaudible are enclosed in double round brackets (( )).
